

Patch To On Point Quilt

This is an easy quilt to put together.
You will be very surprised.

Materials:

This will depend on how big you want this.
* I used 5" blocks, but you may use any size square, like 4½" or 6".

The thing that you must remember when you do this is that length is double the width.

By this I mean: Sew 7 blocks in your row - you will make 14 rows.

Sew 6 blocks in your row, you will make 12 rows.

The pictures in these directions will show 4 across and 8 rows.

* However, when I do this, I like 7 across, 14 down, I used 98 blocks.

Sewn together



How to cut the blocks.





Lay your pieces as shown at the left.

Sew together. Your quilt top will be square

Borders and Binding for a 7 x 14 (which ends up being app. 45" square)

Inside Border: $\frac{1}{3}$ yd.
 - Cut (5) 2" strips. Sew together end to end.
 - Subcut (2) 45" (measure) for sides
 (2) 48" (" ") for top/bottom

Outside Border: $\frac{1}{2}$ yd.
 - Cut (5) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew end to end.
 - Subcut (2) 48" (measure) for sides
 (2) 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (measure) for top and bottom

Binding: $\frac{1}{2}$ yd.
 - Cut (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for binding
