YOUTH SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Children ages birth to 5 are invited to participate in the Story Seekers program, every Monday and Friday at 11:00am. (Now virtual!) A variety of literacy activities are introduced that include reading, writing, talking, singing, and playing! Within two weeks of the library building closing to the public in March, story time had gone virtual. Thanks to a core group of families, we were able to continue engaging the children while being apart, even across three states!





While the library was still open this winter, we offered a variety of entertaining programs, starting with our grand New Year's Eve party and balloon drop. More than 200 people celebrated the start of 2020 with us. In January, we started a new Kulinary Kids program, where a dozen budding chefs learned some basic cooking skills while making grilled cheese sandwiches, smoothies, wraps, and pancakes! Later in the spring, we celebrated Dr. Seuss Day by enjoying a meal of green eggs and ham, while learning all about chickens with Mike Morton.

The library is now offering a 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program for our youngest readers, through our new Beanstack software. We encourage all families and caregivers to read at least 1,000 books with their young children before they enter Kindergarten. Reading to your infant, toddler, or preschooler builds vocabulary and helps prepare them with the skills they need for school. Check out the library's website for more information on Beanstack, start logging your reading, and win some special prizes! In as little as 15 minutes a day, you can build the skills for future school and life success.



In 2019, the library was a recipient of a Teen Reading Lounge Grant through the PA Humanities Council. The Teen Reading Lounge program is a humanities-based book club, based on the belief that encouragement to choose creative pursuits and interest-focused programs is crucial to teen development. Thanks to the grant, the library updated the furniture in our teen space and held two TRL book club meetings before switching to virtual programming in March.





Teen Book Club facilitators were able to partner with Pitt Bradford faculty and staff, as well as local artist Laura Hickey, to provide programs this winter. Thanks to the grant, the library mailed books and art supplies to the teens to keep them engaged while the schools and library were closed.

The Middle Ground Book Club members were some of our most active program participants this spring and summer, taking advantage of the many weekly art workshops we offered, in addition to the regular book club meetings—sometimes even meeting twice a month! As we move forward, the library is planning a series of virtual young adult and middle grade author visits. Contact the library for more information if you are interested in participating! Recruitment is ongoing for both Middle Ground and Teen Book Club.



ADULT PROGRAMMING



In February, we offered a series of 4 beginner computer classes on Microsoft Word, Excel, Facebook, and Google. Almost 50 people participated in the classes, picking up valuable knowledge that will help them in their day-to-day lives. The library also hosted an Adult Summer Reading program for the first time this year. Readers could earn badges by logging books through Beanstack. Each person who completed six badges was entered for a chance to win an Amazon gift card.

The Bradford Area Public Library offers a wide variety of informative and entertaining programs for adults in our community. In 2020, we were able to successfully continue our adult programming with a series of pre-recorded videos and live virtual sessions. Our Coffee with a Curator series has been a huge hit, discussing a piece of local Bradford history biweekly. If you're looking to create something new from items you already own, check out our biweekly Upcycle This! series. More than 150 people tuned in to "Libraries Rock!" to see local bands Marshmellow Overcoat and inTwo rock out to some classic hits and original songs.





LIBRARY STATISTICS

2019 was a banner year for programming attendance. For the first time ever, the library had more than 10,000 people attend our children's programs! In 2020, the library pivoted to virtual programming due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We have seen great success with our live and pre-recorded virtual programs, and plan to continue using the Zoom, Facebook, and Beanstack platforms throughout the fall and winter.










2020 numbers are from January 1 to September 18

The library's "Imagine Your Story" summer reading program looked a little bit different this year. Summer reading participants attended nine weeks of workshops via Zoom and learned all about fairy tales, mythology, and legendary creatures. Throughout June, July, and August, 510 Grab-and-Go Kits were given out to children of all ages to complete hands-on projects and activities, including deliveries to local preschool and daycare classes. More than 70 children tracked their reading through our new Beanstack software and read a total of 4,427 books! That's a 65% increase from last year. We also provided 620 summer snacks to local families.

2019 Operating Income




In 2018, government funding made up 38% of the library's revenue. Last year, this dropped to 23%, due to cuts from the Bradford Area School District. Thankfully, 2019's operating income was greatly supplemented by \$65,000 worth of grant funding. There is much uncertainty surrounding state funding in 2020 and 2021, so we appreciate your donations and gifts. Support from community members like you enables the library to maintain high quality services and provide dynamic programs that elevate the library to one of the best in the area.


2019 Operating Expenses

While the library building was closed through April, May, and June, circulation of eBooks increased by 85% as compared to the same period last year, and 71 community members took advantage of OverDrive's temporary digital cards. After Memorial Day, curbside service was initiated for our patrons, and 11,004 physical items have been checked out through September 18th.
