


Just A Word

Garden Design



Trivia Night





Craft & Learn Series:



Tech Tutor Block


Join us on Tuesday, April 9 and 23 from 10 AM - 12 PM

to receive help with **basic** computer questions. Pick up some new skills in a friendly, one-on-one environment. Registration is necessary. **Call 814-362-6527.**




Middle Ground Book Club

Earth Day


